MARTIN COUNTY H1N1 VACCINATION CLINICS OPEN TO MORE PRIORITY GROUPS

**SATURDAY – NOVEMBER 21
CITY OF STUART FIRE RESCUE DEPARTMENT**

**10:00 AM – 3:00 PM
(or until vaccine supply runs out)**

The Martin County Health Department will host an H1N1 vaccination clinic on **Saturday, November 21st** at the City of Stuart Fire Rescue Department at 800 SE Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd in Stuart from 10:00 am – 3:00 pm (or until vaccine supply runs out).

THE H1N1 VACCINE WILL BE OFFERED TO THE FOLLOWING PRIORITY GROUPS:

- children nine years old and under who have had their first dose of the vaccine in the past 21 to 28 days.
- Pregnant women
- Caregivers of infants under 6 months of age
- Health care workers and Emergency Medical Technicians
- Person 25 to 64 with chronic health conditions
- Children and young adults ages 6 months to 24 years of age

At this time, the vaccine will not be offered for persons over the age of 64. More clinics will be scheduled as the vaccine supply rises.

H1N1 Update:

H1N1 activity in Martin County is now considered widespread. The Martin County Health Department has provided approximately 4000 doses of the H1N1 vaccine during several public clinics. Up to now, approximately 9300 doses of the H1N1 vaccine have been disbursed to health care providers in the community.
